**Daniel 7:1** *In the first year of Belshazzar king of Babylon Daniel saw a dream and visions in his mind as he lay on his bed; then he wrote the dream down and related the following summary of it.*

### —Visions God gave to Daniel

First 6 chapters focus on Daniel and his 3 friends

Great examples of **FAITH** toward God

and

**GOD'S FAITHFULNESS** to us in our faith.

## Another way of outlining the book by Kings under whom Daniel served

1-4	Daniel under Nebuchadnezza
5	Daniel under Belshazzar
5:1	<i>Belshazzar the king held a great feast for a thousand of his nobles, and he was drinking wine in the presence of the thousand.</i>
6	Daniel under Cyrus & Darius
6:1	<i>It seemed good to Darius to appoint 120 satraps over the kingdom, that they would be in charge of the whole kingdom</i>
7-8	Daniel under Belshazzar
7:1	<i>In the first year of Belshazzar king of Babylon Daniel saw a dream and visions in his mind as he lay on his bed; then he wrote the dream down and related the following summary of it.</i>
9-12	Daniel under Cyrus & Darius
9:1	<i>In the first year of Darius the son of Ahasuerus, of Median descent, who was made king over the kingdom of the Chaldeans</i>

## Another way is by language:

<b>Chapters</b> 1:1 thru 2:4 8:1 thru 12:13 <b>Were written in HEBREW.</b>	<b>Chapters</b> 2:5 thru 7:28 <b>Were written in ARAMAIC</b>
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**HEBREW** was the appointed language through which revelation was made and recorded. **ARAMAIC** was not just the language of Babylon but was the international trade language of the day. **ARAMAIC** was to Daniel's time what **KOINE GREEK** was to Paul's time. **ARAMAIC** was what **LATIN** was to the Roman Empire. **ARAMAIC** was the international means of communication.

**HEBREW** is used to emphasize **separation**, **ARAMAIC** emphasized **universality**. When we read in the **HEBREW** we realize that this was specifically for **the Jews**. But when we come to **ARAMAIC**, we easily see that God was going **beyond the Jews** to all **Gentile nations**. Daniel has **two messages**:

- 1) to the **Gentile** world in history, the development of Gentile powers and,
- 2) **Israel's** relationship with each of these Gentile world powers, giving encouragement and hope to the Jewish people wherever they are in history, whatever power they are under the control of; whatever slavery, torments, tribulations, even attempted annihilation – God is in control, God loves them, and God has a Plan of their Redemption in the land of Israel!
