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




Who Was Zephaniah

- Zephaniah was the human author of the prophecy of Zephaniah
- He is not mentioned historically in any other book of the Bible
- The only information we have on him is in Zeph 1:1
- He was a contemporary of Jeremiah & Nahum because verse 1 says he was a contemporary of King Josiah



I. Verse 1: Genealogy

The word of the LORD which came to Zephaniah son of Cushi, son of Gedaliah, son of Amariah, son of Hezekiah, in the days of Josiah son of Amon, king of Judah.

Zeph 1:1



^{*} Or named after the Egyptian God Amon

Theophoric names include (literally bear) the name of God



Parallels between Zephaniah & Deuteronomy (1)

II. Zephaniah 1:2-3 The Prophetic Context

- "I will completely remove all things from the face of the earth," declares the LORD.
- "I will remove man and beast;
 I will remove the birds of the sky
 And the fish of the sea,
 And the ruins along with the wicked;
 And I will cut off man from the face of the earth," declares the LORD.

Tribulation like nothing seen so far in history!

- "I will completely remove all things from the face of the earth," declares the LORD.
- "I will remove man and beast;
 I will remove the birds of the sky
 And the fish of the sea,
 And the ruins along with the wicked;
 And I will cut off man from the face of the earth," declares the LORD.

Gen 6:7

The Lord said, "I will blot out man whom I have created from the face of the land, from man to animals to creeping things to birds of the sky; for I am sorry that I have made them."

- Religious Apostasy 1:4-6
 - I will stretch out my hand
- [Day of the Lord 1:7]
- Official Apostasy 1.8-9
 - Then it will come about
- Commercial Apostasy 1:10-11
 - On that day
- Common Apathy 1:12-13
 - It will come about
- [Great Day of the Lord 1:14-16]
- General Judgment 1:17-18

Time Markers



Day of the Lord (Ryrie)

- Three facets of the Day of the Lord
 - Historical God's intervention in the affairs of Israel (*?Zeph 1:14-18?; Joel 1:15) and heathen nations (Isa 13:6; Jer 46:10; Ezek 30:3)
 - Illustrative whereby an historical incident represents a partial(*?typological?) fulfillment of the eschatological Day of the Lord (Joel 2:1-11; Isa 13:6-13)
 - Eschatological Day of the Lord Includes:
 - Great Tribulation (Isa. 2:12-19; 4:1)
 - Second Coming of Christ (Joel 2:30-32)
 - Millennium (Isa 4:2; 12; 19:23-25; Jer 30:7-9)

*Note: My personal belief is that Zeph 1:14-18 is part of the tribulation, not a past historical event; There should be a single literal fulfillment of prophecy, not a partial & full fulfillment




Day of the Lord (Mattox)

- A close study of Zephaniah 1:14-18 will reveal that the judgments included in 'the Day of the Lord' extend throughout the tribulation and include the events just prior to the 'return of the Lord' to this earth. Therefore, 'the Day of the Lord' includes the tribulation.
- Zechariah 14:1-4 clearly includes the events of the Second Advent in 'the Day of the Lord."
- A study of 2 Peter 3:10 extends the period covered in 'the Day of the Lord' into the new heavens and new earth. Therefore including the entire millennial period.

Israel's Two Regatherings

This is the Gospel Message Zeph 2:3

- Seek the Lord
 - How do I do that?
 - Assumes you really want to do the will of God
 - This sets the context of the next two phrases which answer the question of how do I seek the Lord
- Seek Righteousness
 - Righteousness is the issue for salvation and for fellowship with God
 - The question is whose righteousness & how do I get it?
- Seek Humility
 - What is humility?
 - It is a thought, an attitude, Grace Orientation
 - Here the mental attitude is paralleled to a physical condition which shows how we approach God
 - We have NOTHING but faith when we realize we are in abject spiritual poverty; this is how we approach God – with FAITH!!!



Gospel Message of Zephaniah

Revised Amplified Translation (2:3):

Seek a personal relationship with the Lord [Yahweh, i.e. Jesus Christ], those of you who are determined to do the decisions [will] of Him


Seek [the Lord's] righteousness

Seek [abject spiritual] poverty/humility [grace orientation which leads to faith in the Lord]

Note: Typically, you seek something you do not have

Philistia

- Are the "Palestinians" the equivalent of the Philistines?
- Palestinians currently occupy only Gaza
- Will they conquer Ashdod, Ashkelon and Egron in the future?



Moab & Amon

 Jordan currently occupies the ancient land of Moab and Amon.



Cush

- Most modern texts read "Ethiopia"
- But Cush of the Bible is a nation of black people just south of Egypt.
- Today this equates to Sudan




Assyria

- There is no current day equivalent to ancient Assyria
- Will ISIS or something following ISIS conquer northern Iraq and Western Syria?

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Summary of Charges

Four "NO"

 Woe to her who is rebellious and defiled,
The tyrannical city!
² She heeded no voice,
She accepted no instruction.
She did not trust in the LORD,
She did not draw near to her God.
³ Her princes within her are roaring lions,
Her judges are wolves at evening;
They leave nothing for the morning. 1
⁴ Her prophets are reckless, treacherous men;
Her priests have profaned the sanctuary. 2
They have done violence to the law.

Four Errant Leaders



Negative Spirituality

- Zeph 3:2 She heeded no voice, She accepted no instruction. She did not trust in the LORD, She did not draw near to her God.
- Zeph 3:2 structured like the Hebrew text:
 - Not she listens to Voice
 - Not she takes to Discipline
 - In Lord Not she trusts

Intake and Application
Of Bible Doctrine

Faith of the believer

- To her God Not she draws near Fellowship with God



Gathering of Nations

 8 "Therefore wait for Me," declares the LORD, "For the day when I rise up as a witness. Indeed, My decision is to gather nations, To assemble kingdoms, To pour out on them My indignation, All My burning anger; For all the earth will be devoured By the fire of My zeal.



Baptism of Fire

- Matthew 3:11 John the Baptist indicates there will be a Baptism of Fire prior to the arrival of the kingdom. Also mentioned in Isaiah 4:4 [from deanbibleministries.org Matthew lesson 11]
- 2 Thes 1:7-9 Baptism of Fire on unbelieving Gentiles and unbelieving Jews. [from springvalleybiblechurch.org Thessalonians lesson13]
- Zephaniah 3:8 "...For all the earth will be devoured by the fire of My zeal."




III. Humbled People with Purified Language

- The people who emerge from the Tribulation will have been humbled to the point that they KNOW that God is in charge and can do anything. They will have no illusions of self grandeur!
- Going back to the parallel with the Flood
 - After the flood, after the tower of Babel, God gave the people a multitude of languages
 - After the Tribulation, God will provide a "purified language"



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Israel's Two Regatherings





Blessing & Prominence of Jews/Israel

 He concludes his book with a brief prophecy about the Millennium (Zephaniah 3:14-20). He reveals that the Lord will regather all believing Jews back to the land of Israel and that He will live in their midst (Zephaniah 3:17-20). And he promises that God will make the Jewish nation the prime nation of the world (Zephaniah 3:20).



Summary

- Zephaniah is an Old Testament parallel to the New Testament book of Revelation
- Zephaniah's target audience are the Jews of the Tribulation, especially Jerusalem and Judea
- Zephaniah contains both a form of the Gospel and a form of spirituality
- Zephaniah makes sense if you use 1:2-3 as a guide to the context and do not try to cut up the prophecy into little pieces to show fulfillment in disparate places for the various pieces.
